

Thoughts From Our Pastor



Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

I want to thank all who participated in our Annual Catholic Appeal last Sunday. This week, we will conduct a follow-up at all Masses so that everyone has a chance to participate in the appeal process.

When our individual gifts are combined with the gifts of thousand other parishioners through the Archdiocese, each contributor makes a very real difference in the ability of the Archdiocese to provide ministries and services. Gifts of our time, talent and treasure to our parish and our Archdio-

cese are an important part of our commitment to stewardship of God's gifts. Those who have contributed to the 2017 Annual Catholic Appeal are expressing their gratitude for God's gift to them and to others.

In our Gospel today, Jesus tells us that we can't serve two masters. If we attempt to serve both of them, we will hate one and love the other. He continues to tell us that we cannot serve God and wealth. But is Jesus saying that we cannot serve God and money? What Jesus is telling us today is to be conscious of what we are doing because we might try to keep God and money in balance, but will soon find the balance tipped to one side – probably to money. When our balance is tipped towards money or material possessions, we became so attached to them that we neglect our Christian duties. Christ is not telling us that we should not work for money. We need money at all times. We need money to buy the necessities of life, and work is the best way to obtain money. The problem is being so attached to the money we make and the things money can afford that we let them rule our lives.

We cannot give God the devotion He wants if we have given our heart and soul to money and the things money can buy. Jesus wants us to seek first Kingdom and his righteousness, and all what we seek will be given. Let us try to put God first in whatever we set out to do.

Don't Be Anxious

People have, it seems, a natural penchant for misplaced emphasis on unimportant things. They can easily get caught up with what they're having for dinner or what they will wear.

Often it is a tragedy that helps people to refocus on what is really important. What I shall wear is an irrelevant question when I am facing surgery or chemotherapy. What's for dinner is immaterial to those living through grief or unemployment.

In today's Gospel, Jesus tells us not to worry. He doesn't say, "Don't eat. Don't cook. Don't buy clothes." He says, "Don't worry." Jesus asks us not to relinquish our responsibilities but to let go of our anxiety. Anxiety betrays a lack of trust and Jesus reminds us that "Your heavenly Father knows" all that you need (Matthew 6:32).

MARCH 5, 2017 -1st SUNDAY OF LENT

First Reading: Genesis 2:7-9; 3: 1-17

The account of the sin of Adam and Eve is a classic example of how everyone sins. The author recognized that there is a standard pattern: We toy with temptation...we fall...then we make excuses.

Second Reading: Romans 5:12-19

Paul's letter to the Romans is his most detailed and important theological work. His purpose in this passage is not to teach about original sin, but to contrast Adam and Christ.

From Adam we inherited a strong pull toward sin. From Christ (*the* "*new Adam*") we received a gift that is incomparably stronger: Divine grace.




Women of the Word Our facilitator will be **Shelby S. Boblick, Pastoral** Associate at St. Catherine-St. Lucy Church.
