## Thoughts From our Pastor Rev. George O. Omwando



Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

As we approach summer time, there is so much that is happening in our community. For instance, some of our parishioners, friends, and relatives went to the Four Winds Casino this past Saturday to enjoy camaraderie together. And even if, as I am told, there were some transport delays, everyone indeed enjoyed the relatively chilly day. I also wish to take this chance and request you to consider participating in our events that are periodically hosted by the Fundraising Committee. These events take place annually supplement our badly needed cash to run our community. I am grateful for the efforts of the Fundraising Committee in executing these events.

Our Family Mass was not well attended especially from the school and from some of the religious education families; nevertheless, those that participated were inspired by some of our young religious education kids. I was not able to attend as I had a prior commitment of giving a reflection to a group of 35 women across the Archdiocese doing a week-end retreat known as Cursillo (short course) at the formerly closed Mount Assisi High school in Lemont. Coincidentally, I will not be able to celebrate the Eucharist this Saturday as I have to attend the Lay Ecclesial Ministry graduation of Kevin and Marci Morgan at Mundelein Seminary. Indeed, they are special parishioners who kindly share their talents with us and go above and beyond their duties as volunteers and we are very proud and thankful of them.

Our Parish Leadership Meeting that was hosted in the Rectory's basement went well and I am pleased to learn of all that is happening in our community. This weekend, we welcome our Religious Education students that are going to receive their First Communion and I would like to personally thank Christine Wedekind and her staff for their passion, hard work, and dedication in preparing them.

Finally, as you are aware, every year the month of May is devoted in honor of the Blessed Virgin Mary. She teaches us that there is nothing that is impossible in God's eye. Mary serves as a great example especially to countless women who suffer each day from domestic violence or all any other forms of exploitation. We also remember countless women across the globe that have challenges in raising and taking care of their children. The mother of Jesus went through many challenges in raising her son with Joseph alongside. She and her husband had to flee to Egypt after Jesus was born in Bethlehem in Judea during the time of the dreaded King Herod who wanted to kill the infant child as we learn from the Scriptures: "That night Joseph left for Egypt with the child and Mary, his mother and they stayed there until Herod's death." (Mathew 2:13) Mary constantly witnessed the betrayal and rejection of her son under some religious authorities, and the climax was when she witnessed the crucifixion and the scourging of her son. Mary therefore serves as an example to countless women in our society who suffer daily, or who have witnessed the death of their children - for instance: some unjustified police shootings in our cities, nationally and internationally. We remember those who have been involved in violent crimes, imprisonment etc. and suffer a great deal. We pray that Mary, the mother of Jesus, watch over them and all of us. ## MAY 13, 2018 – ASCENSION OF OUR LORD

### First Reading: Acts 1:1-11

Today’s passage take us back to the beginning verses of the Acts of the Apostles and sets forth the themes that Luke is going to develop throughout this, the longest book of the New Testament. His major theme is the role of the Holy Spirit, who enables the apostles to be effective witnesses to Jesus. The Holy Spirit is mentioned 57 times in the Acts of the Apostles.

### Second Reading: Ephesians 4:1-13

Today’s passage from Ephesians was chosen because of its reference to Jesus’ ascent to heaven, which is contrasted with his descent to the dead. Early Christians believed that those who died before the coming of Jesus awaited redemption in a shadowy existence described here as the lower regions of the earth. It is our Christian tradition that immediately after his death, Jesus went to these people to announce that they had been saved.

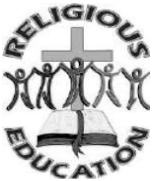

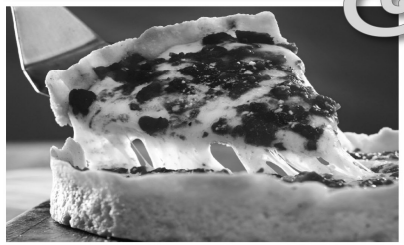
