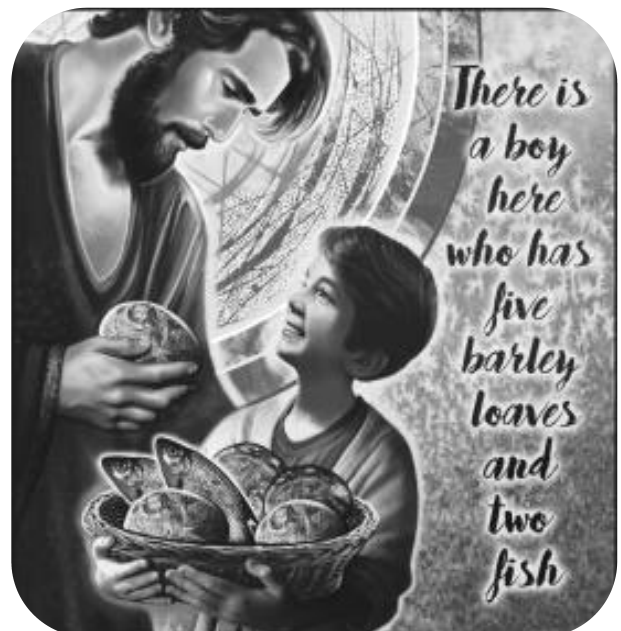

From Rev. John W. McGivern, Administrator

Dear Parishioners,

Today's Gospel reading from the evangelist John begins the great narrative from which the Church has developed much of its eucharistic theology. The multiplication of the loaves is the only miracle story which appears in all four of the Gospels. This fact alone underscores the importance that the Gospel writers placed on this event in the life of our Lord. In the Johannine account we heard today, however, the initiative to feed the people comes from Jesus himself.

As one strips away the specifics of place and time, we are left with this: Jesus sees the hunger of the people; he responds to their need and, putting himself at the service of the people, he distributes the bread which nourishes them.

The Gospel of John is working on two levels as it relays this story. First, it is a miraculous event by which our Lord is able to feed his followers. It is a messianic story in that God has once again provided abundantly for God's people. Just as God had showered the Israelites with manna from heaven, and just as God had miraculously fed the throng of people who listened to the prophet Elisha, (today's first reading), God continues to provide abundantly through the ministry of Jesus.

On a second and deeper level, the bread is symbolic of Jesus himself (and of his paschal mystery). The Christian community believes that Jesus is the one who fulfills the will of the Father by responding in love to the hunger of his Father's people. Understanding that human hunger is only fully sated through loving union with God, Jesus chooses to offer his very person to be broken (on the cross), poured out and distributed that all people may once again share in the unifying feast of God's love.

In the following four weeks, we will continue to read from the Gospel of John. Today's Gospel reading is a prologue, of sorts, to the narrative on the bread of life which will now follow.

The time has now come that we bid farewell to Fr. George Omwando. For more than 9 years, Fr. George has been your spiritual leader and guide. He has presided over most of the parish liturgies and all of the parish baptisms, weddings and funerals. He has immersed himself into your lives, and done so with faithfulness, love and total commitment.

I hope that Fr. George know that he shall always be welcome here at St. Catherine/St. Lucy Parish. In fact, he is welcome to come and stay in the parish rectory whenever he likes—perhaps on his day off or whenever he needs to get away.

Fr. George, your spirit and your kindness is embedded into the life of this community. We are forever grateful. Know that our doors and our arms are always open to you. Thank you, and may our Lord bless you.

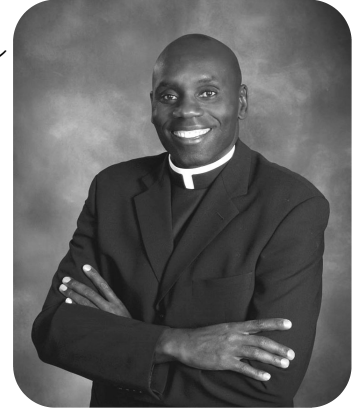

God bless Fr. George with wings of hope and success.

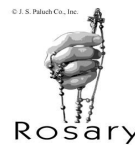

First Reading: Exodus 16:2-4, 12-15

The book of Exodus tells of the Israelite’s escape from Egypt and their journey to Mount Sinai some 1200 years before Christ. The bread described in today’s reading is called *manna*, a word derived from the ancient Hebrew words for “what is this?”

Second Reading: Ephesians 4:17, 20-24

In our series of readings from the letter to the Ephesians, we have come to a part of the letter which gives advice for daily living. Today’s reading describes the effect of baptism. In the water of baptism, we symbolically die to one way of living and rise to a new way of life.

One Lord, One Faith

Do you suppose the authors of the four Gospels were aware of today’s first reading from the second book of Kings? Of course they were. The prophet Elisha fed a hundred men with twenty barley loaves in order to prove God’s power. This same miracle, now multiplied by more people fed by fewer loaves, is attributed to Jesus in all four Gospels. In today’s passage from John we even have the detail that the loaves were barley, reminding every pious Jew of that miracle that Elisha worked. Yet Jesus went into hiding when they wanted to make him king. It is the passage from Paul’s Letter to the Ephesians that gives us the reason for this. The power of Jesus comes from God. It is not meant merely to feed us, or to provide one group with a king. There is one Lord, one faith, one God and Father of all who works through Jesus Christ and through us all.

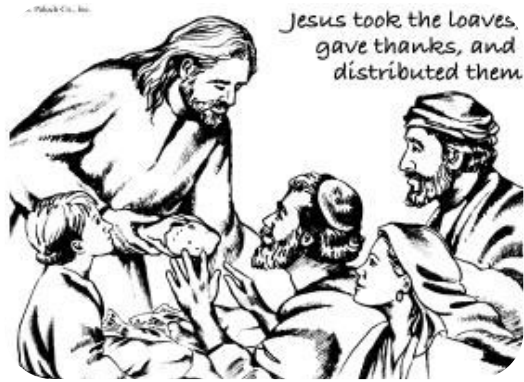


Sacrament of Reconciliation

Re-opening the Parish

- ..# Registration is no longer required.
- ..# There are no capacity restrictions.
- ..# There is no longer any need to do screening for COVID.
- ..# Masks will be strongly encouraged for individuals to continue to wear.
 - Ë We will have masks and hand sanitizer bottles available at the church entrances.
 - Ë We will have signs that will state something like "For the safety of everyone, masks are strongly encouraged to be worn while inside church".
 - Ë Greeters will NOT sanitize hands upon entering church and before Communion, but we will have containers for self-sanitizing at the Communion station, as well as at church entrances.
 - Ë In time, there will be changes to the pew arrangements, continuing to offer and encourage a small amount of social distancing.
- Pews might be roped off.
- ..# Sanitizing church after every function is no longer necessary.
- ..# Austin Blvd. and Washington Blvd. entrances may be used for entering and exiting.
- ..# At this time, the receptacle for the collection of donations will remain at the front of the pews.
- ..# Congregational singing may return though this will inevitably conflict with mask wearing. We will use hymnals again, and Worship Aids be printed).
- ..# For the time being, we will continue to have the gifts of bread and wine already at the altar and not brought forward by others in the assembly.
 - For Communion, 2 lines may process forward. There will continue to be no distribution of the consecrated wine.

A Farewell to Summer

In William Shakespeare's gloriously beautiful sonnets, he humanizes winter and summer. Summer acts warm and welcoming; Winter's behavior is cold and harsh. When Fr. George Oruko Omwando initially joined our faith community, he came with summer his companion. As he leaves us, the sun's incandescent, reassuring rays holding his hand, our enclave will be enveloped in the chill and darkness of winter's clouds.

In stock market terms, such a move is termed bearish: A pastor transferred with surprise from his parish, with loss by the faithful of eternal summer. Not sure of Swahili, but here we say "bummer." Our favorite reign has adjourned.

It's nine years ago that our Fr. George started. With engaging smile, and profoundly good-hearted, George the First became our pastoral royalty, showing us love and unshakable loyalty, which his community returned.

Thoughts of our man can be framed by a triangle; Obvious talents leave no room for wrangle. Character, leadership, spirituality, Spanish emersion expands bilinguality. In priestly life, nothing's unearned.

Fair, kind and true would the great Bard describe him; Sensitive, humble, informed, we'd ascribe him. A smile to captivate, brightening the room, he'd learned how to excise the darkness and gloom, an energy level well-turned.

A comfortable leader, he wants the right option. (could we keep him on if we signed for adoption?) He honors leadership from the Archdiocese; Much that we see there is hypochondriasis. In that office, it comes well-learned.

He's dependably strong, like a tall mighty oak; But soft with our children as laughter he'll stoke. His kindness With Fr. John Carolyn showed enough love to create a spiritual ode. That candle unendingly burned.

Our Father's deep faith calls us each to be witness; For pastoral challenge, he just was all fitness, as he would square up to handle his crucible, and show shining faith that was never reducible. "God will show me the way."

In today's second reading, St. Paul says to Christians in Ephesus: "I urge you to live in a manner worthy of the call you have received, with all the humility and gentleness, with patience, bearing on one another through love, striving to preserve the unity of the spirit through the bond of peace." Our priest, our pastor, our friend, lives in a manner worthy of his call.

Finally, who can top Shakespeare, where he writes: "For summer and his pleasures wait on thee, and thou away, the very birds are mute, or if they sing, 'tis with so dull a cheer, that leaves look pale, dreading the winter's near."
